Parent/Carer Code of Conduct

At Beecroft Garden Primary School, our parents/carers recognise that educating children is a process that involves partnership between parents/carers, pupils, class teachers and the school community. We believe in welcoming and encouraging parents/carers to participate fully in the life of our school.

The purpose of this policy is to provide a reminder to all parents/carers and visitors to our school about the expected conduct.

At Beecroft Garden, we expect all parents, carers and visitors to:

- Respect the ethos, vision and values of our school
- Understand that both teachers and parents/carers need to work together for the benefit of their children
- Demonstrate that all members of the school community should be treated with respect and set a good example in their own speech and behaviour
- Approach the school to help resolve any issues or concerns
- Seek to clarify a child's version of events with the school's view in order to bring about a good resolution to any issue
- Supervise your own child at all times when you are in school to ensure their conduct does not lead to conflict, aggressive or unsafe behaviour

In order to support a peaceful and safe school environment the school, we ask all parents/carers and visitors not to:

- Display disruptive behaviour which interferes or threatens to interfere with the operation of a classroom, office area or any other area of the school grounds
- Use loud/or offensive language, swearing or cursing
- Threaten to do actual bodily harm to anyone
- Damage or destroy school property
- Send or leave abusive or threatening emails, texts, or any other written communication or voicemail/phone messages
- Defame the character of the school or our staff on social media
- Physical aggression towards another adult or child
- Approach someone else's child in order to discuss or chastise them because of their actions towards their own child
- Smoke, drink alcohol or take other drugs on or around the school grounds
- Bring dogs on to school premises (guide dogs and hearing dogs are permissible)

In the unusual event of any of the above behaviour occurring on the school premises the school may feel it is necessary to contact the appropriate authorities and, if appropriate, even ban the offending adult from entering the school grounds.

We trust that parents/carers will assist our school with the implementation of this policy and thank you for your continuing support of the school.
